



The new boat trailer has a beach launching wheel which will hopefully solve some of the difficulties we have launching and recovering patrol boats. The photo accompanying this article will indicate that the new boat is very similar to our existing Zodiac which has provided excellent service over the past few years. While the new boat goes under the brand name Mercury, Wes assures me it comes from the same factory and is constructed from the same excellent quality fabric and to the same high standards as the Zodiac.

Could I remind eligible patrol boat drivers that the first ten hours of the new motor should not exceed half throttle and the RPM should be varied no later than every fifteen minutes.

Our new sailing season will be a time to renew old acquaintances and to establish friendships with new members. Your committee has a number of things under consideration to improve the amenities and the fellowship of the club. I shall leave those things for others to elaborate on in this newsletter. 

This will be an important event for promoting both our Yacht Club to prospective members, and the Sailing School.



Three Medals at Rio Olympic Test Regatta for Australia

The official Test Regatta was run last month, in Rio de Janeiro, as a dress rehearsal of the 2016 Olympic racing format and schedule and on course. Ten Australian sailors were in the field of 339 from 52 nations and we competed in six out of the ten boat classes. Of the six, we qualified in five [Finn, Laser, 49er, Men's 470, Nacra 17] for the final top-ten Medal Race Day.

Jason Waterhouse and Lisa Darmanin kicked-off the final Medal Race Day with a Gold Medal in the *Nacra* 17 catamaran class, which will premier on the 2016 Olympic program. The pair put together a complete performance across the 12 race series. The Australians finished every race within the top eight and their consistency proved to be invaluable as they won over the current World Champions Billy Besson and Marie Riou from France into second place.

In the *Men's 470* dinghy class there was a lot of pressure on current Olympic gold medallist Mathew Belcher and World Champion Will Ryan going into the final Medal Race. The top nine boats were all in reach of a gold medal, but the Aussies claimed gold after finishing second which secured them the win by two points. It was challenging week for the pair with up and down results, including a disqualification in a race at the beginning of the regatta.

Tom Burton won the bronze medal for Australia in the *Laser*. It was a nail-biting result which saw Burton move in and out of the medal ranks throughout the final race.

It was a very good regatta for Australia, not only on the results but also what the team learned about the

tricky courses, currents and winds. Stay tuned in 2016.




