The 14ft skiffs' national championships were sailed on Sydney Harbour. A fleet of 43 boats contested the titles. Victorian boats dominated the regatta. The series was won by *Irwin Sails*. *Grunt* was runner up and *Susan Day* skippered by Guy Bancroft was third. Scott Bancroft in *Beam Me Up* was sixth. All of these boats have sailed at Flinders.

The Australian 14ft Sailing Council has also agreed to amalgamate with the International 14 class. This will create the opportunity for Australian boats to race internationally. There are about 350 active skiffs around the world sailing in Australia, New Zealand, Canada, USA, UK, Japan, Germany, Denmark, Italy, France and Switzerland.

Rear Commodore's Controversial Win in Labour Day series

⁻ Boats which do not compete in an Aggregate race because their skippers are on rostered race duty, or which are actively participating in State or National Class Championships, are awarded points for that race equal to their average points for races started during the series. (This figure will vary as the series progresses; the final average cannot of course be calculated until the series is completed.)

RCD Hits Flinders

If you drive quietly down the track to the clubhouse early in the morning you can hear the faint morbid cry "bring out your dead." Yes, Rabbit Calicivirus Disease (RCD) has hit the Flinders foreshore. Our neighbours, Floppsie, Moppsie, Peter and the rest of the rabbit families are in mourning.

Dead rabbits can be found all through the scrub. It remains to be seen how permanent the control will be. Rabbits which come into contact with the disease in the first few months are immune for life. Their offspring are not. The disease will not completely eliminate the rabbit population. It is likely numbers will fluctuate up and down as the disease hits, the young survive, numbers build up and the disease hits again. Conventional control techniques should be used in conjunction with RCD.
